

MARATHON BRAND

Marathon Brand gasoline is available through approximately 5,100 branded locations in 18 states in the Midwest and Southeast. MPC locations are predominantly owned and operated by independent entrepreneurs. In addition to quality MPC gasoline and diesel, these locations offer a wide range of services, from convenience store products to car washes to co-branded fast food to mechanical repairs and service. During 2010, Marathon Brand outlets sold approximately 4.1 billion gallons of transportation fuels.

WHOLESALE MARKETING

Marathon Petroleum is a large wholesale supplier of gasoline and distillate to resellers and consumer end-users within its market

area. Independent retailers, unbranded jobbers, airlines, transportation companies, railroads, marine companies and utilities form the core of MPC's wholesale customer base. Light product sales are made at 63 company-owned and -operated and approximately 45 third-party terminals throughout 18 U.S. states.

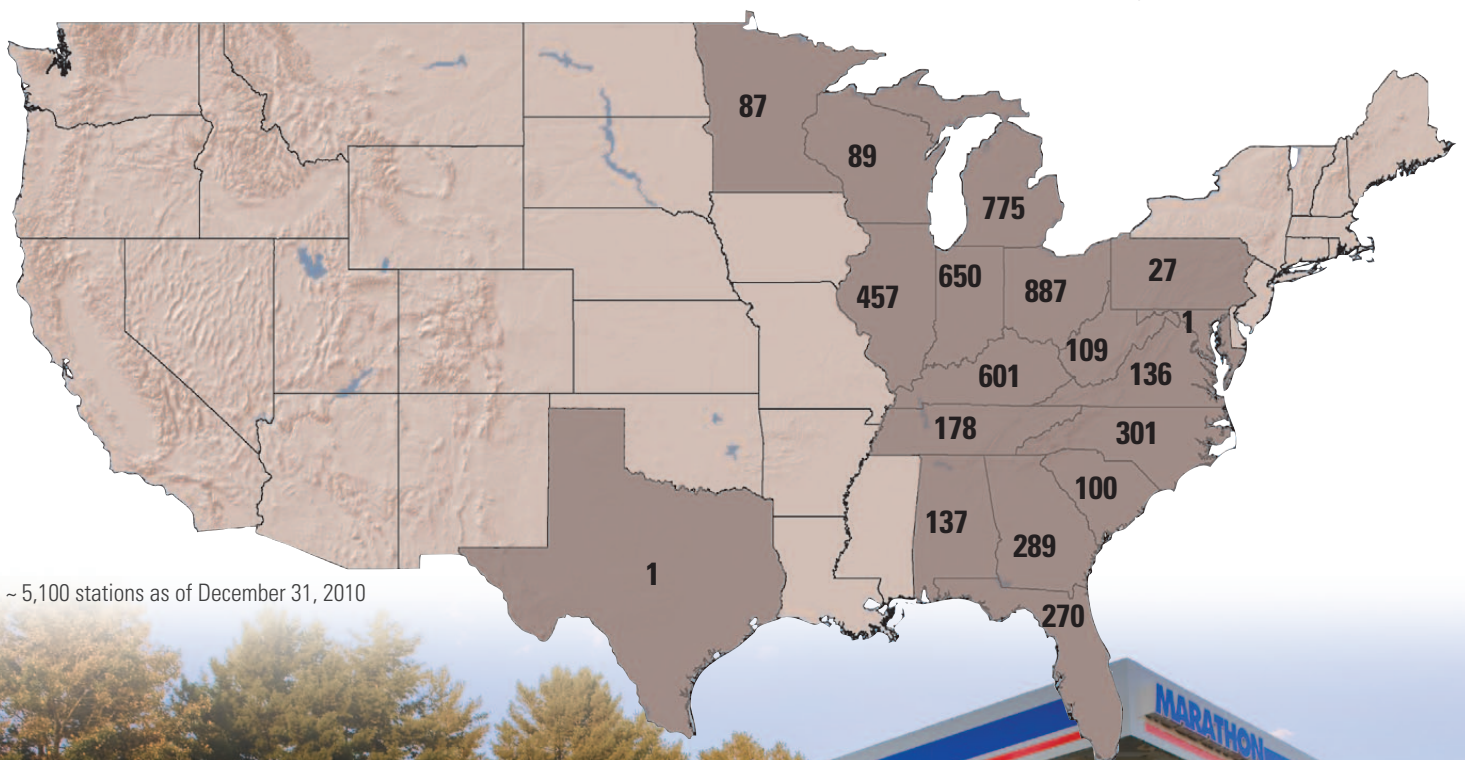
ASPHALT, COKE AND HEAVY OIL MARKETING

Marathon Petroleum is one of the U.S.'s largest asphalt producers in terms of capacity. The company markets asphalt through 21 owned and 12 leased terminals located throughout the Midwest and Southeast that are supplied by four of MPC's refineries. (Robinson and Texas City do not produce asphalt). The MPC customer base includes

asphalt paving contractors, government entities (states, counties, cities and townships) and asphalt roofing shingle manufacturers. MPC also markets heavy oil from all six refineries and petroleum coke from Garyville and Robinson.

SPECIAL PRODUCTS MARKETING

Marathon Petroleum is a producer and marketer of various petrochemicals and specialty products. Propane and sulfur are produced and sold at all six MPC refineries. Propylene, ranging in purity from refinery grade to polymer grade, is produced and sold at all refineries except Canton. The Catlettsburg refinery produces cumene, toluene, xylene and dilute naphthalene oil. The Texas City refinery produces benzene, toluene and xylene.
