Meet Our Neighbor: Susie Mulcahy

Twenty miles outside of Los Angeles lies the vibrant town of Wilmington. And at the intersection of Avalon Boulevard and Denni Street is an ARCO gas station that truly captures the town's spirit.

In addition to typical gas station services, this ARCO also features a car repair shop and a Charlie's Sub Sandwich Shop. On a typical weekday, customers buzz through the gas station. At the nucleus of this frenetic energy is Susie Mulcahy, the driving force behind the station for almost 39 years.

From Monday to Friday, Mulcahy works 10 to 12 hours a day. She comes back for a few hours on Saturday. "I'm here so much that the employees are an extended part of my family," Mulcahy said.

Some employees become mainstays at Mulcahy's shop. Her investment in their lives translates to attending their fundraisers and cheering their kids on at sports games. It's the Wilmington spirit that propels her.

"The community is really close-knit," Mulcahy said. Beyond supporting her employees, she also dedicates herself to other community causes, such as the Wilmington Coordinating Council's Police Night Out, Wilmington Jaycees' Meals on Wheels, and Banning High School's baseball and softball teams, as well as the Wilmington Chamber of Commerce's Christmas toy drive for the Mahar House. "A lot of the people grow up here and they stay here. There are a lot of good jobs here on the port and in the refineries. I've had customers that worked for me as teenagers, and they're adults now and have kids."

Before Mulcahy's husband, Charles, passed away in 2015, the couple fulfilled their long-standing dream of expanding the gas station. They enriched the premises with a remodeled garage, a new kitchen and the addition of the sandwich shop. It was a love letter to the community.

Now, Mulcahy looks to the future. She doesn't see many changes. "I've been here for almost 39 years, and I plan to stay here. People ask me if I plan on retiring, and I say, 'You know what, I've got bills to pay,'" Mulcahy said. "I tell everyone, 'You're still stuck with me!'"

Meet Our Employee: Joe Arrizon



Joe Arrizon is an inspiring leadership figure at the Los Angeles Refinery.

Many members of the Marathon Petroleum team come from our own communities. Through skills training and pipeline programs in local colleges, Marathon Petroleum recruits homegrown talent to work at our facilities. One such team member is Joe Arrizon.

Arrizon is a turnaround superintendent at the Los Angeles Refinery. He grew up in the area and created a career at Marathon Petroleum. Before assuming his current position, Arrizon thought his career trajectory with Marathon Petroleum would go from operator to shift foreman, but it took a turn to maintenance then

turnarounds.

"Growing up around refineries and going to Gulf Avenue Elementary, I remember being in the third grade and meeting refinery workers. It had a positive impact on me," Arrizon said.

Although Arrizon has had a successful career with Marathon Petroleum, his service goes beyond what he does in his community. In 1996, Arrizon left Wilmington and joined the Marine Corps. He was hired by Marathon Petroleum following his service to our country and deployed in 2004 while still employed with the company.

"[Marathon Petroleum] is

a veteran-friendly company," Arrizon said. "It worked out for me. There are lots of veterans [who] work with me, and we have the same mentality."

Today, Arrizon's drive comes from his love for his family. His daughters are 14 and 10 years old, and, like Arrizon, they've grown up knowing about the science of oil refining and are proud of what their father does.



For the second year in a row, Marathon Petroleum Corporation has earned the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) ENERGY STAR Partner of the Year award, which recognizes top-tier energy efficiency and excellent environmental compliance.

Marathon Petroleum has participated in the ENERGY STAR program ever since the EPA began awarding the recognitions to refineries in 2006, and its refineries have earned more ENERGY STAR awards than all other U.S. refiners combined. **Marathon Petroleum is the only refining company to earn the award in 2018 and 2019.**
