Our Catlettsburg refinery, located in northeastern Kentucky on the western bank of the Big Sandy River, processes both sweet and sour crude oil. The facility supports regional energy demand through operations that emphasize environmental stewardship, strong community partnership and promoting a culture of safety. Products at the refinery are distributed efficiently through pipelines, barges, transport trucks and rail.

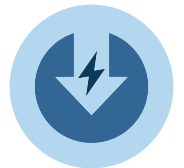
REDUCING GREENHOUSE GAS EMISSIONS - PROGRESS DRIVEN BY ENERGY EFFICIENCY
