Our Galveston Bay refinery is located in Texas City, Texas, on Galveston Bay off the entrance to the Houston Ship Channel. In 2018, Galveston Bay merged with MPC's former Texas City refinery to create a single, world-class refining complex. The refinery operates with a strong commitment to environmental stewardship, community engagement and a culture of safety. With access to the export market and multiple distribution channels, refined products are efficiently delivered through pipelines, barges, transport trucks, rail, and ocean tankers.
