Located along the Cook Inlet, approximately 60 miles southwest of Anchorage, Alaska, our Kenai refinery plays a vital role in fueling the state. It primarily processes Alaska domestic crude, supplemented with a variety of domestic and international crudes. The refinery supplies high quality fuel and fuel products that meet the needs of Alaskans across the state.

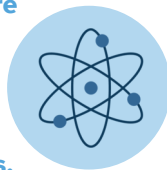
