Established in 1908, our Salt Lake City refinery has grown into the largest refining facility in Utah, processing crude oil from Utah, Colorado, Wyoming, and Canada. The facility supports regional energy demand through operations that emphasize environmental stewardship, community partnership and promoting a culture of safety. Products at the refinery are distributed efficiently by truck through a system of terminals and by pipelines.
