ANACORTES REFINERY SUSTAINABILITY HIGHLIGHTS

Our Anacortes refinery, located approximately 70 miles north of Seattle on the Puget Sound, supports regional energy demands through operations that emphasize environmental stewardship, community partnership and promoting a culture of safety. The facility processes a broad range of feedstocks, including Canadian crude, domestic crude from North Dakota and the Alaska North Slope, as well as international sources. Products are distributed efficiently through pipeline-connected terminals and MPC's marine terminal via ships and barges. Our refinery not only supplies fuels to the Anacortes region but also supports the community through active involvement and local investment. Safety remains a top priority at the facility, supported by a strong safety culture and a track record of earning industry safety awards.
