Our Los Angeles refinery, located in Los Angeles County near Los Angeles Harbor, stands as the largest refining facility on the West Coast. As a major producer of clean fuels, the refinery processes heavy crude from California's San Joaquin Valley and Los Angeles Basin, along with crudes from the Alaska North Slope, South America, West Africa, and other international sources. The facility supports regional energy demand through operations that emphasize environmental stewardship, strong community partnership and promoting a culture of safety. Refined products are efficiently delivered through its connections to several product distribution pipelines and terminals.
